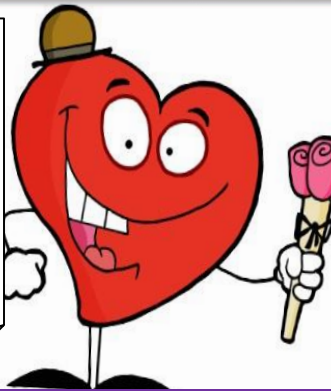

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## Notes from the Teacher

## **Notes From the Teacher Continued...**

- ♥ **Reading Folders:** Reading Folders are being sent this week, freshly stocked! Remember, to read each book at least 3 times a week to build fluency, then ask questions about the character, setting and details about the beginning, middle and end! Don't forget to ask more abstract questions too, like "what may have happened if...?" and give an alternate ending or change an event. Doing these things, paired with practicing sight words, are the most powerful things you can do to help your child grow as a reader.
- ♥ **Response to Text (inside Reading Folders):** Once your child reaches a certain Reading Level (usually D or above), I will be sending home a little Response to Text inside a book or two in the Reading Folder. Encourage your child to read the question themselves (with your help if needed,) and answer in writing, using complete sentences after he or she has read the book several times. This will help improve comprehension. Once students get to higher levels of reading, responding through writing is a requirement, and they cannot reach higher levels without responding in writing, using proof from the text, adequately. If you have questions about higher levels of text, feel free to ask at conferences!
- ♥ **Kiss-O-Grams:** Check out the Kiss-O-Gram half sheet that came home in your child's folder. Your child can buy their friends and teachers a card/Hershey Kiss that will be delivered on Valentine's Day up until Monday, February 13<sup>th</sup>. Kiss-O-Gram money can be sent in a labeled envelope or baggie, and your child can buy their Kiss-O-Grams in the mornings in the main lobby before the tardy bell rings, or in the Library all day.
- ♥ **Conferences:** I look forward to having a conference with you! Come with any questions you have to help your child grow academically! I'm always willing to share information/ advice on what you can do to help at home☺
